

LEATHER CARE & MAINTENANCE

- Dust/vacuum regularly. Wipe up any spills or dirt immediately with clean, absorbent cloth or sponge.
- **Cleaning:** can be done with a soft, damp cloth, but do not soak the leather.
- **Stubborn spots:** gently apply mild soap & water solution on surface. Repeat using clean water only.
- **Suede & Nubuk Leathers:** require special cleaning. The above is not recommended for these.
- **Do not** use saddle soap, wax polishes or spray polishes.
- Avoid letting buckles, studs and zippers come into direct contact with the leather.
- Avoid drying out the leather, taking extra care when used near direct sunlight, heat sources or fireplaces.

Protect your investment. With proper care, you will enjoy your quality leather furniture for a long time!

GLOSSARY

- Aniline:** Leather that has been colored by immersion in dyes rather than painted on the surface with pigments.
- Antiqued:** A leather style featuring surface markings or creases which often are given a contrasting color.
- Corrected Grain:** Leather whose surface has been buffed, removing natural marks to give a the grain a more uniform appearance.
- Full Grain:** Leather in which no attempt is made to hide or “correct” the natural markings of the animal's hide.
- Grain:** The pattern visible on the surface of a hide, formed by pores and hair cells.
- Hand:** The characteristic surface “feel” of a leather, whether pebbled, smooth, waxy, or slick.
- Pigmented:** Leather which has been colored with a surface finish of pigments.
- Pull-Up:** Leather treated with oil or wax during finishing, giving a two-tone “color burst” effect when pulled.
- Sauvage:** A marbled appearance resulting from combining similar colors, giving additional depth and character.
- Semi-Aniline:** Aniline-dyed leathers with light top-coating of pigment to achieve an even coloration. The result is a leather with a softer hand than “pigmented” leather.
- Suede:** Leathers finished by buffing the flesh side (opposite the grain side) to produce a velvet-like “nap”.
- Top Grain:** The uppermost layer or grain side of a hide. The layer of a hide typically used for upholstery leather.
